

Deininer book: Specific concerns (1)

Power, officialdom, and rights (ESt):

- Enforcement of property rights
- Quality of bureaucracy, corruption
- Ability of local leaders to control land (rights)
- Accountability of local officials

Deininer book: Specific concerns (2)

Non-market factors

- Inheritance rules
- Amount and award of public/ state land
- Expropriation of land for public good
- Farm restructuring, consolidation
- Social networks (family / clan dispositions)

Deininer book: Tasks

- Re-interpret traditions (read: change institutions of property rights)
- Implement statutory law / put into practise
- Improve land administration systems
